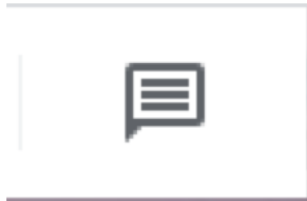

The World Scout Moot

- Worldwide Scouting event, run every four years
 - 2017 – Iceland
 - 2013 – Canada
 - 2010 – Kenya
- For 18 – 25 year olds (Scout Network)
- 6000 attendees from every corner of the world
 - 5000 participants, 1000 supporting adults (IST)





International Experience

- Emphasis on getting to meet other Scouts, understanding their culture and background, and working together
- Participants organised into **International Patrols** of ten Scouts
- Four patrols make up a **Tribe**

International Service Team (IST)

- Team of volunteers who support the delivery of the event
 - Running programme
 - Logistics (food distribution, plumbing, electrics, transport)
 - And much, much more
- Without the IST there would be no Moot!



16th World Scout Moot – 2021



16th World Scout Moot

- Hosted by Scouting Ireland
- Summer 2021 – 19th to 29th July (or possibly longer!)
 - Participants born between 20th July 1995 and 19th July 2003
 - IST born before 20th July 1995
- Moot theme is ‘Le Chéile’ - together



What happens at the Moot - Participants

- **Opening ceremony** – Dublin
 - Participants meet their International Patrol and Tribe
- **Trails** – 6 days, 30 different trails, all across Ireland
 - International Patrols choose the activities they do
- **Base Camp** – 4 days at Malahide Castle
 - More activity and programme, international day, exploring Dublin



What happens at the Moot - IST

- You may be allocated a role anywhere in the Moot programme
 - Potentially IST working on a trail
 - Could already be at the site setting up
 - May miss events like the opening/closing ceremonies
 - **Opening ceremony** – Dublin
 - **Trails** – 6 days, 30 different trails, all across Ireland
 - **Base Camp** – 4 days at Malahide Castle





The UK Contingent

- **Inclusive**

- We will be an inclusive, affordable and representative UK Contingent.

- **Engaged**

- We will be engaged in activities and decisions, be able to develop, and deliver positive outcomes to Scouting.



The UK Contingent

- **Sustainable**

- We will be empowered to be more environmentally conscious and sustainability will be embedded into our decisions.

- **Supported**

- We will be prepared, inform, and support each other so that we all enjoy our Moot experience.

UK Contingent IST

- Are reliable, committed to supporting UK Scouting and WOSM's mission and willing to act as an ambassador for UK Scouts
- Are comfortable actively engaging with a diverse range of people from around the world for at least 8 hours per day
- Have an inclusive mindset
- Are quick to find solutions
- Are willing to work as a part of an international team



UK Contingent IST

- Be at the Moot in Ireland from 17th until the 31st of July 2021 (transport and additional travel options will be available)
- Be able to bring their own camping equipment
- Support with the set up and take down of the World Scout Moot
- Be present and on time to all sessions allocated to whilst at the Moot (It is expected that there will be at least 1 day off at Moot)
- Attend two briefing events, one in your region and one national meet up
- Complete any training required by the event organisers



UK Contingent Add-Ons

- ~~Pre-event – two nights in Belfast~~
 - ~~Choice of excursions and activities~~
 - ~~Social event~~
- ~~Post-event – one night in Dublin~~
 - ~~Farewell celebration and party~~
- Potential for other additional tours (4 days, 3 nights)

“How much does it cost...?”

- The base fee - £895 for IST
 - Moot fee, briefing events, insurance, contingent kit
- Add-ons:
 - Contingent travel - £185
 - Additional tours - TBC

“...that’s a lot!”

- Support from the contingent to **fundraise** – will be others going from the South West
- Possible to apply for **grants** – encouraged to do this when you sign up
- Potential support from **District International Fund**

Applying to attend the World Scout Moot



How do I apply?

- Online form – 10 to 15 minutes to fill out:
 - Basic questions - who you are, how to contact you
 - ‘Scouting Criteria’ – have you been on an international trip before
 - You will need your Membership Number and some referee details (your Line Manager – probably GSL/DESC)

How do I apply?

- Deadline is midnight on 3rd May (next Sunday!)

- **Applying now doesn't commit you to going**



Contingent Application Form

The deadline is midnight on **Sunday 3 May 2020**. It is a ballot system, not first-come-first-served, which means we'll be waiting until applications have closed before allocating spaces, so as long as your application is in before the deadline you will be in the running for a place on the Moot.

To apply, you will need:

- Your Membership Number if you are over 18
- Your parent/carer's permission if you are under 18
- if you are applying for IST you will also need contact details for your Scouting line manager and permission from them to share their details with us



The Selection Process - Participants

- Participants drawn by **random ballot**
- Doesn't matter when you applied, **every ballot is equal**
- Potential for **additional ballot places** depending on 'Scouting Criteria' – to make the contingent **more inclusive** to those who have missed out on international experiences before



The Selection Process - IST

- Unsure exactly how IST are being selected – imagine it will be similar
- Also asked about ‘Scouting Criteria’ when applying - should increase opportunity for those who haven’t taken part in international trips before

Moot Timeline

- 3rd May 2020
 - Application deadline
- June 2020
 - Outcome of ballot
 - Initial deposit to secure place (£400)
- November 2020
 - First Moot briefing day (regional)
- December / January 2021
 - Regional meet ups
- April 2021
 - Briefing weekend
- July 2021
 - The Moot!
